

Lesson 1 – Definition and Purpose of Spiritual Gifts

What is the difference between a spiritual gift and a natural talent? 1) A talent is the result of genetics and/or training, while a spiritual gift is the result of the power of the Holy Spirit. 2) A talent can be possessed by anyone, Christian or non-Christian, while spiritual gifts are only possessed by Christians. 3) While both talents and spiritual gifts should be used for God's glory and to minister to others, spiritual gifts are focused on these tasks, while talents can be used entirely for non-spiritual purposes.

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Lesson 2 – The Temporary Sign Gifts of Scripture

There are some spiritual gifts mentioned by the apostle Paul in three passages of Scripture – Rom. 12:6-8; I Cor. 12:4-10; Eph. 4:11
"Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith; or ministry, let us use it in our ministering he who teaches, in teaching; he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness." Romans 12:6-8
"There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all: for to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, to another the word of knowledge through the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healings by the same Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another discerning of spirits, to another different kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues." 1 Corinthians 12:4-10
"And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers." Ephesians 4:11
The gifts can be divided into two categories: the temporary gifts and the permanent gifts
The 7 temporary sign gifts include:,

"And it shall be that whoever will not hear My words, which He speaks in My name, I will require it of him. But the prophet who presumes to speak a word in My name, which I have not commanded him to speak, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die.' And if you say in your heart, 'How shall we know the word which the Lord has not spoken?'— when a prophet speaks in the name of the Lord, if the thing does not happen or come to pass, that is the thing which the Lord has not spoken; the prophet has spoken it presumptuously; you shall not be afraid of him." Deuteronomy 18:19-22

Note: To rebuke the modern charismatic movements abuse of sign gifts refer to

Deuteronomy 18:19-22; 13:1-4

"If there arises among you a prophet or a dreamer of dreams, and he gives you a sign or a wonder, and the sign or the wonder comes to pass, of which he spoke to you, saying, "Let us go after other gods'—which you have not known—'and let us serve them,' you shall not listen to the words of that prophet or that dreamer of dreams, for the Lord your God is testing you to know whether you love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul. You shall walk after the Lord your God and fear Him, and keep His commandments and obey His voice; you shall serve Him and hold fast to Him." Deuteronomy 13:1-4

• Why were sign gifts needed? The sign gifts were given for

complete. After completion they were no longer needed, full revelation was now
available. Example: Workers when constructing a building use scaffolds. When the
building is complete the scaffolds are no longer needed and are taken down. God's
revelation employed the use of the sign gifts as scaffolds that were taken down once the
Scriptures were complete. Remember, the temporary sign gifts were

Every appearance of a sign gift found in the Bible is used to bring validation and confirmation of God's message and His messenger in order that people would have the opportunity to hear and believe God's Word. After the message was confirmed to be of God, the sign gifts were no longer needed and faded away. Therefore, Christians do not

need to have signs repeated. God's Word, The Holy Bible, has been confirmed so all can receive the same gospel message.

Spiritual gifts do not work in that manner. We are called by God to obediently serve Him in ALL things. Remember, God will never call you to do something that He has not already enabled you by the power of His Holy Spirit to complete!
